# Bike to Work Week

*Promoting Biking and Walking in the Monadnock Region!*

**Overview:** National Bike Month (May 2017) and Bike to Work Week (May 15-19 2017) are important opportunities to encourage bicycling and walking as well as other alternatives to vehicle use.

**Subcommittee Goal:** to coordinate “Bike to Work Day” events in Keene and possibly other communities in May 2017.

**Expected Time Commitment:** ~4 hours/month, February 2017 – May 2017



# Carsharing Feasibility

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*Help bring carsharing the Monadnock Region!*

## Overview:

- Transportation option that offers the benefits of having a car without the cost or hassle of private ownership.
- Usage-based rental service that provides access to a dispersed network of shared vehicles throughout a campus, community, or region at unattended, self-serve locations.

**Subcommittee Goal:** to work with community partners to determine the feasibility of carsharing in the Monadnock Region.

**Expected Time Commitment:** ~ 3 hours / month, February 2017-December 2017



# Bicycle Friendly Community (BFC)

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*Help communities achieve a “Bicycle Friendly Community” Designation!*

## Overview:

- The League of American Bicyclists' Bicycle Friendly Community (BFC) program is a tool for communities to make bicycling a real transportation and recreation option for all people.
- Communities are assessed through a voluntary application process and recognized in one of six categories.

**Subcommittee Goal:** to work with the City of Keene to increase the City's BFC ranking from Bronze to Silver status.

**Expected Time Commitment:** ~3 hours/week, February 2017 - October 2017



# Municipal Transportation Fund

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*Flexible and local funding for transportation alternatives!*

**Overview:** [NH RSA 261:153](#) VI: communities have the option to charge an additional fee, up to \$5, to be used towards a transportation fund.

## Subcommittee Goals:

- to gather information about the opportunities and challenges to utilizing the \$5 optional fee
- to conduct an education and outreach campaign that targets municipalities and interested stakeholder groups.

**Expected Time Commitment:** ~ 3 hours / month, February 2017-December 2017
